POST-BACCALAUREATE OUTCOMES DATA NOTES:

- 1. Knowledge and Outcome Rate data are available for AY's 2019-2023. Data collection methods for AY 2019-23 included the UMKC Graduation Survey, National Student Clearinghouse matching for continuing education 6-months (or more) after graduation, and UMKC Advance employment match 6-months (or more) after graduation. Career Services began collecting the outcomes data with the AY2021 cohort, using the 12Twenty software service.
- 2. Known Post-baccalaureate Status is defined as "... the percent of graduates for which the institution has reasonable and verifiable information concerning the graduates' post-graduation career activities." (NACE, 2014)
- 3. Successful Graduate Outcomes is defined as "...the percentage of [known] graduates who fall into one of the following categories: employed full-time, employed part-time, participating in a program of voluntary service, serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, or Enrolled in a program of continuing education." (NACE, 2014)
- 4. Total degrees awarded by academic program/plan include those plans awarded to graduates with multiple majors or double degrees.
