8:30 am Call to Order

Amanda Campbell, Chair

- -Amanda calls the meeting to order at 8:32
- -Amy Schaefer presents on the 51st St. Pedestrian Zone. Step 1 was closing down the area/street. Step 2 we are beginning now, kicking off a community input/outreach portion of the project.
- -51st St. Project Process: evaluate and develop initial study, campus community input, develop concepts for leadership review and approval, finalize design approach (anticipated installation is spring break 2025). The project is envisioned as a phase process, "may not see everything we want on day one, but can augment as we go" -Word Cloud: attendants invited to participate and indicate their favorite space on UMKC or other campus. "Quad" and "student union rooftop" get quite a few votes. Most important consideration for the new space: "accessibility" gets a quite a few votes. Also, a case study of a similar project at Purdue is shown. Yard games, outdoor fireplaces, lighting (not that we will necessarily have all of these things, just ideas) -a survey regarding 51st St will be distributed by email this week

8:35 am **Chancellor's Talk**

Chancellor Agrawal

- -past couple of years have seen incredible changes at UMKC:
- 1) highest graduation rates for ugrads in a decade, highest retention rates in a decade
- 2) largest incoming class in history was 2023 (this year we saw about a 4% increase). 58% of our incoming students were first generation, 51% were Pell eligible. 25% Hispanic, 16% African American. We know if we give first gen students a bit of extra assistance, their GPAs are higher than the UMKC average.
- 3) International graduate enrollment is down, we will be strategic about trying to get their numbers up again. Good news is applications are up across the board for this time (for 2025)
- 4) We should know by March 2025 whether we are Carnegie R1, research expenditures have more than doubled in the last 5 years. Haven't hired a bunch more researchers, just optimizing the existing researchers and getting them the staff assistance they need.
- 5) The areas where we think we have good traction: data analytics/AI, electromagnetics (microwaves, interactions of electromagnets with biological systems), MIDE is about 100 people strong, tied to DoD, materials research, humanities. Applicable to medicine and



defense. Dr. Clancy Martin has received notoriety for his book, an app he helped develop also received national attention

- -work at St. Jo's is going well, should be ready to move in fall 2025
- -51st will remain a street (not dug out), asphalt will remain for emergency vehicle use, this took about 4 years to complete
- -construction in the library for student success pieces is on track for opening fall 2025,
- -health sciences campus, groundbreaking has occurred, however they discovered soil on site was contaminated, still on schedule
- -next project Chancellor will be working on is the conservatory. Perhaps a new building.
- -Streetcar is on schedule, should be completed in spring 2025. Rails are in place, landscaping remains, then the streetcars will run without passengers. Chancellor expects they will really open to the public in second half of 2025
- -Soccer team went to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament! Twice defeated the no. 3 team in the nation, won the conference
- -budgets will be tighter going forward (unsure about state money, enrollment will be critical). 5 years ago we were down to 3 or 4 months of operating budget in reserves, we've about doubled that by now

Questions:

- 1) Deliveries to Plaster will have to be scheduled
- 2) DEI transition—DEI office was closed. Missouri legislature made this call. Pros/Cons of a centralized office, symbolically important, though with a decentralized approach, we can make inclusivity everyone's job. Andre will head a "coordinating council" that tracks measures of how different populations are faring at UMKC. Chancellor mentions that UMKC serves a very diverse population and so we must continue to serve that population.
- 3) SGA will be represented on the "coordinating council"
- 4) Health Sciences campus to be ready fall 2026
- 5) Foodiverse is delayed by about 1 month, should be ready to go by February 2025 (cafeteria will no longer exist in Atterbury, only in Student Union)
- 6) Rockhill Road diet? No plans at this time, but they are working on Troost. After student was killed, Chancellor and Rockhurst president met with City of KC to determine steps forward.
- 7) Student retention strategy? Holsinger is working on this. FirstGen Roos, MoCA, Career Services, all seem to be working very well. Question is if/how we scale up these programs (some may not be scalable). Partnering with Georgia State to understand how to better intervene for improved retention



- 8) Staff retention: Chancellor monitors numbers, turnover has not increased over the last few years. He mentions that he would like to hear ideas from us about what should be done.
- 9) What if DoE goes away? Pell money? Chancellor doesn't think the federal money will go away, but also says there are many "what ifs" and we can't focus too much on those. If things change dramatically, we will have to seek out more private funding
- 10) Wall Street Journal ranked us 1 or 2 for student experience, also high for student salaries after graduation. We are emerging as a regional presence, hope to make it to national presence, too.


