Meeting summary for Staff Council Monthly General Body Meeting (Fall 2024) (10/02/2024)

#### Quick recap

Amanda led discussions on upcoming voting member nominations, staff support, and recognition, as well as updates on the Admin Council, Chancellor's diversity, Faculty Senate, and the Board of Curators. Dylan announced plans for a selfie submission giveaway, the search for volunteers for the next UMKC Day at the Disney exhibit, and a Halloween costume contest.

#### Next steps

- Here are the key action items from the meeting:
- Amanda to send email reminder about platform statements due October 5th to those who haven't submitted yet.
- Communications Committee to send out October newsletter next week.
- Membership and Engagement Committees to organize new staff coffee connections event in November.
- Staff Council members to consider which committee they want to join if elected as new voting members.

#### Summary

Upcoming Elections, Innovations, and Staff Support Amanda discussed the upcoming voting member nominations and elections, emphasizing the deadline for platform statements and the



voting process. She also introduced Sarah as the new treasurer and led a brainstorming activity on innovations to streamline processes. The conversation ended with a discussion on staff support and recognition, with participants expressing a need for more leave, particularly due to the new PTO, and suggesting free food and better support.

System Board Responses, Updates, and Initiatives Amanda led the meeting, discussing the responses to be sent to the System board of Curators for additional staff opportunities. The September meeting minutes were approved, and Jess reported on the treasurer's report, noting they were slightly above budget. Amanda provided updates on the Admin Council, Chancellor's diversity, Faculty Senate, and the Board of Curators. She mentioned the new executive board for Isac and ongoing tasks for the Board of Curators. Amanda also discussed the P. IP and the mock B question, encouraging staff to participate in the background survey and update themselves on suicide prevention training. She highlighted the upcoming domestic violence awareness month in October, mentioning a calendar with daily action items and encouraging participation in a resource fair event at the club. Amanda expressed her interest in learning more about domestic violence prevention and action items.

#### Team Updates, Budget, and Art Show

Amanda reported that the team had spent a small amount of money, leaving them with a significant budget for future use. She also mentioned that the team is working on updating the Casey Kudos website and possibly changing its name to align with the brand. Amanda also announced the upcoming Diastole Staff Art Show on November 19th, inviting submissions by November 14th. Dylan expressed his excitement for Sarah's new role as treasurer and his desire to keep her in the co-chair position.

Selfie Giveaway, Volunteer Search, and Upcoming Events Dylan announced plans for a selfie submission giveaway and the search for volunteers for the next UMKC Day at the Disney exhibit. He also mentioned the organization of smaller scale coffee and chat events to welcome new members and a potential haunted spaces tour. A



Halloween costume contest was also announced, with prizes to be given out. The D&D group was noted to have not met recently but another meeting was planned for the month. The Parents and Caregivers group had a successful lunch event, and plans were made to accommodate its growing size. Dylan also mentioned a career services meetup at the Renaissance festival and a conference and staff appreciation lunch scheduled for May 20th.

Staff Engagement, Development, and Upcoming Events Dylan discussed the early stages of development and encouraged staff engagement, especially for the vacant co-chair position in the engagement committee. Amanda highlighted voting member nominations, the new staff coffee connections event to connect new staff with Staff Council, and the need for voting members to join committees like the new membership committee. Laura and Destiny discussed recent book collection and upcoming volunteer events like Disney Day and Boo at the Zoo. Arin announced the upcoming Professional Development Conference in May, upcoming wellness and campus resources events, and a graduate programs event on October 29th from 3-4:30pm. Amanda shared announcements about the November "Bring a Friend" meeting with the Chancellor speaking, a fraternity/sorority affairs trunk or treat event on October 30th open to staff and families, and LGBTQIA History Month events.

Updates and Initiatives for Awareness Months She also mentioned a Trunk or Treat event and encouraged participation. Alyson shared updates about Domestic Violence Awareness Month and the Close Line Project, as well as a partnership with Newhouse, PC to light up the roof statue purple. She also mentioned Disability Week. Laura announced an entrepreneurship lunch event. Kimberly asked about opportunities for other staff to provide feedback for the upcoming ISAC meeting, to which Amanda responded positively.

If you haven't attended before, it's a powerful showing of community care led by our External Relations & Community Engagement team, as well as by the co-chairs of the program. We're excited to attend, to hold this space, and for the opportunity for our students to attend at no charge and start networking with LGBTQIA community members and allied businesses.

October 11 from 11am-3:30pm – National Coming Out Day & Rainbow Read-In

October 11th is celebrated as National Coming Out Day, which holds space for the many ways that LGBTQIA folks come out, not just once, but as a regular occurrence as we navigate the world. We're excited to continue our tradition on campus of the National Coming Out Day Closet Door, which we invite students, faculty, and staff to sign, adding their names to a long legacy surrounding the symbolism of the closet and coming out as well as new traditions on-campus, including new ways to show your pride and support of National Coming Out Day. Additionally, this year, we are partnering with Drake Summers who will be offering the Project UnLoneliness activity "Colors & Connection" (with a National Coming Out Day twist) to better help our students connect with one another.
